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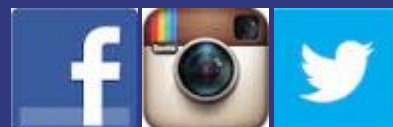

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Classroom News:

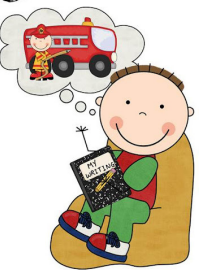
Grade P-3: This week in the prep-3 room we have had a great week of learning.
