AN ENORMOUS THANK YOU

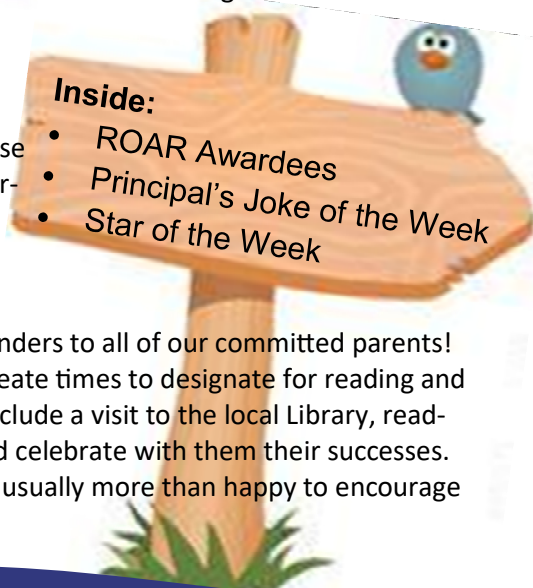

Grade P-6: Wow hasn't the term flown by! Some great learning achievements so far this year and all students should be proud of their efforts.

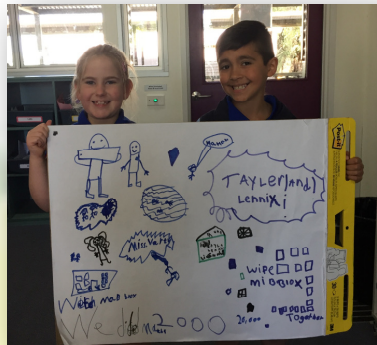
In maths we have been continuing to explore fractions and their related decimals and have been applying this learning in real life settings such as decimals in time and length. In literacy we have started to create our own narratives.

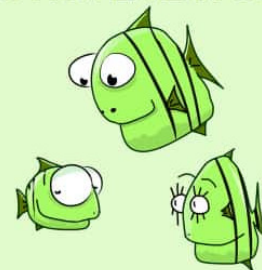

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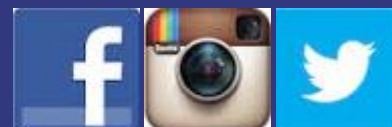
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UPDATE FROM: GREATER SHEPPARTON COLLEGE (INTERIM NAME)

BUS TRAVEL APPLICATION FORMS

A reminder to all parents and carers regarding completion of bus travel application forms for students at Greater Shepparton College (interim name) next year.

If you are planning to utilise student bus travel next year, a bus travel application form for your child/ren must be fully completed, and returned to either your current secondary school (or to McGuire campus if your child is commencing in Year 7 next year). If a completed bus travel application form is not received for your child prior to the end of Term 3, we will assume that you do not require bus travel for your child next year.

If your child has been a regular student bus traveller in the past or currently, you still need to complete the form so that we have up to date information about all student bus travellers for 2020 please.

Information regarding student bus allocations for 2020 will be made available during Term 4, 2019.

FREE TRAVEL FOR ALL STUDENTS DURING TRANSITION PERIOD

Free travel will be available for all students attending the Greater Shepparton College (interim name).

All students who currently use the School Bus Program, along with those who will be new to the program during the transition period, will get free bus travel until the College opens on a single campus.

In addition, all government secondary school students who travel on public transport to the College, will have their ticket cost fully covered by the Conveyance Allowance Program until the College opens on a single campus.

Between now and 20 September (end of Term 3, 2019), schools will work with families and students to submit applications for the School Bus Program or the Conveyance Allowance Program.

Application forms for next year's Year 7 students and all travelling students will be handed out to students and families after enrolment acceptance (around 8 August 2019). Schools will work with these students to submit applications by 31 August 2019.

Schools will notify families of student's bus allocations in Term 4, 2019.
