MANAGING ASTHMA DURING WINTER

As we move into the colder months it is important to consider some of the impacts the colder weather can have on our health and how we can potentially lessen the impact.

That students identified with asthma do have an Asthma Action Plan

Winter brings cold weather and keeps us inside where indoor triggers such as dust mites, pet allergens, smoke and viruses can worsen asthma symptoms. Cold, dry air may cause airways to tighten, making breathing more difficult.

Winter is also the season for colds and influenza. As many as 8 out of 10 asthma attacks in children and 4 out of 10 in adults are triggered by viral infections. All the more reason to have a written asthma action plan. If you do not have a written Asthma Action Plan please discuss this with your doctor next time you visit.

As with any other time of year, it is very important to keep your asthma under control. This includes having regular reviews with your doctor, taking the proper medication regularly as indicated on your Asthma Action Plan and avoiding your asthma triggers. Make certain that you have a copy left with your school.

INDEPENDENT READING PRACTICE

Reading at home is a high priority with many families reading up to two short books an evening to their child prior to bed.

Students need just right books for independent practice and for their skill development. Make certain that you chat with your child about the story that they are reading, ask questions and allow for their comprehension. Students will reflect when the reading is shared through such conversations.

How quickly has this term flown!






During the period 2006-2013 Robynne Nelson completed research in Australia, Mauritius and India, which resulted in the book *Dharmalan Dana* being written and published by Robynne and her father Uncle George Nelson.

During that time, Robynne uncovered a much broader story behind why Aboriginal people decided enough was enough and walked off the mission as a united force to be reckoned with.


