Tyran has done a great job these past couple of days and really had a red hot crack at his work. Great job Tyran!!



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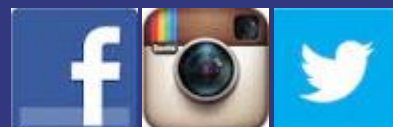
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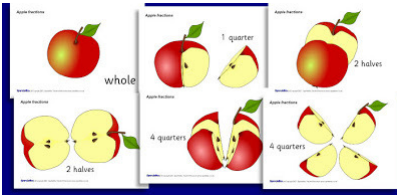


Class Newsflash
